

Project to be managed by the Ross County Engineer.

Bid proposals and specifications for these improvements may be obtained at the office of the Ross County Engineer, 755 Fairgrounds Road, P.O. Box 458, Chillicothe, Ohio 45601, Monday through Friday, 7:30 A.M. until 4:00 P.M.

Each bidder is required to furnish with its proposal, a Bid Guaranty and Contract Bond in accordance with Section 153.54 of the Ohio Revised Code. Bid security furnished in Bond form, shall be issued by a Surety Company or Corporation licensed in the State of Ohio to provide said surety.

In addition to Local Funds, this project will receive OPWC Loan Funds.

The completion date for this project will be no later than October 17, 2026.

Prevailing wage rates to be paid under this contract shall be those ascertained by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Bureau of Wage and Hour.

The 2023 Construction and Material Specifications of the State of Ohio Department of Transportation shall apply to this project.

All bidders must conform to Section 153.59 of the Revised Code concerning discrimination.

The Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all bids and waive irregularities.

Instructions to Bidders**

- 1. Each bid shall be made on the form hereto attached and shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope and endorsed on the outside of the envelope.**
- 2. Each bid shall be accompanied by a surety bond, certified check or cash as required in the "Notice to Bidders".**
- 3. Each bid shall contain the full name of every person or company interested in the bid.**
- 4. Each bid shall state the unit price for each item of work enumerated in the proposal, which price shall be in full for all necessary material, labor and equipment required for complete execution of the work.**
- 5. Bond will be required of the successful bidder in an amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and full payment of all claims sub-contractors, materials, men and laborers on account of the work covered by the contract; the surety upon said bond is to be an authorized surety or Guaranty Company authorized to do business in the State of Ohio, Satisfactory to the Ross County Commissioners. The Contractor shall guarantee for a period of one year from the date of completion of the proposed work that it is free from all defects due to faulty materials or workmanship. The contractor shall promptly make corrections as may be necessary by reason of such defects. The Engineer will give notice of observed defects with reasonable promptness. In the event that the Contractor should fail to make repairs, adjustments or other work which may be made necessary by such defects the Engineer may do so and charge the Contractor the cost thereby incurred. The Contract Bond shall remain in full force and effect through the guarantee period.**
- 6. All blanks in the contract documents must be properly filled in. Prices shall not be bid for items not appearing in Engineer's estimates. Where alternate bids are permitted, the filling in of either alternate will be sufficient. No additional prices or qualifying clauses shall be written in.**
- 7. The contractor shall procure and furnish liability insurance to satisfactorily cover any and all claims, against himself and the County arising from the performance of this contract, or in any way connected therewith. Contractor must meet 107.12 of the Ohio Dept. of Transportation Construction & Materials Specifications.**
- 8. Employees of the contractor, working under this contract shall be protected by Workers Compensation in accordance with the Laws of the State of Ohio. Such protection shall remain in full force and effect during the term of the contract.**
- 9. Prevailing wage rates to be paid under this contract shall be those ascertained by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Relations, Wage and Hour Administration provided for in the Revised Code of Ohio.,**

Please note: Attached wage rates are subject to change.

10. Work must be commenced within N/A days after the execution of the contract and will be completed **October 17, 2026**. Any work done as stated in contract extension shall be started as soon as possible. In case of disagreement on this time, the decision of the County Engineer will be final.
11. No bid will be allowed to be withdrawn for any reason after it has been opened.
12. Within 30 days after the satisfactory completion of the work under contract, payment will be made. The contract will terminate with final payment. Items will be paid as bid for in the proposal.
13. The contractor shall have completed the work on or before the calendar date specified in the proposal or on or before a later date if a contract extension has been granted by the County Engineer, otherwise the Engineer shall proceed as provided in 108.07 or 108.08 of the Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and material Specifications.
14. The method of performance of work as stated in contract shall conform to the specifications of the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation in force on date of letting except as noted herein. Any variation must be approved by the County Engineer.
15. The protection of the wearing course is to be observed. Unnecessary blocking of traffic will not be allowed.
16. Grading, scarifying, pulverizing, stabilization of the base shall be done by the County Highway Department , unless otherwise specified in contract .
17. A county inspector shall be present at all times while work is being performed. Tickets for work done without an inspector present will not be included in any estimate or work paid for. The inspector has the right to make changes as deemed necessary and to decide if the work may proceed. No claims for damages will be accepted for losses caused by any such ordered shut downs or delays. A reasonable prior notice of time and place of work is to be given to the County Engineering Department.
18. The contractor shall furnish all lights, signs and barricades, tools, equipment, labor and incidentals, necessary for the proper completion of the project. The cost of above items shall be included in the unit price bid per ton of asphalt incorporated in the project.
19. Flagmen will be furnished by the contractor and will be on duty during the performance of all work . The cost of this item shall be included in the unit cost per ton of asphalt incorporated in the project. All traffic control signs shall be in accordance with the Ohio Uniform Traffic Control Manual.
20. When work is shut down the contractor shall provide lights, signs, barricades and etc. necessary to sufficiently protect the traveling public.
21. The County Engineer or County Inspector may vary the rates of application of bituminous materials as necessary on all work. The unit bid prices to be paid in such cases.
22. All driveways will be given a 2' +/- approach depending on the slopes of the driveway.

Please note: Attached wage rates are subject to change.

23. All bidders must conform to Section 153.59 of the Ohio Revised Code concerning discrimination.

24. No spraying of diesel fuel on tailgates or beds will be permitted.

25. Contractor must go back at least 10' on all intersections or as Directed by the County Engineer or County Inspector .

26. All Milled Roads must be paved within 28 Calendar Days.

**27. Successful bidder must perform all work. No sub – contracting shall be permitted.
(Except Bid Items 254, 614, 642, & 644 only)**

28. All bidders must be currently Pre-Qualified by the Ohio Dept. of Transportation.

29. AC Bands shall be placed at all joints where asphalt overlay meets existing pavement. (Price of this item to be included in the price of asphalt.)

30. Contractor must use the 2023 O.D.O.T. Construction and Material Specifications.

ATTENTION BIDDERS

Item 401.07 – Hauling:

Refer to sentence in 2023 ODOT Spec Book under their item (401.07) "Do not exceed a haul distance of 50 miles (80 km) from the asphalt concrete plant to the paving site regardless of prevailing air temperature except by specific permission of the Department (County Engineer)."

This distance, 50 miles is actual road miles traveled.

ATTENTION BIDDERS

Asphalt Binder Price Adjustment will not be included in this contract. Also, Fuel Price Adjustments will not be included in this contract. Bid Price for all items will be final. No Adjustments will be made.

ATTENTION BIDDERS

All materials and application, for the entire project, shall meet item 441 of the 2023 O.D.O.T. Construction and Material Specifications, additionally, the Asphalt Plant must be State Approved.

ATTENTION BIDDERS

Two (2) Law Enforcement Officers with 2 patrol cars will be required during all work performed on Anderson Station Road. These officers will assist your flag persons for traffic control. Please refer to the Traffic Eng. Manual 642-55 Item 614 Law Enforcement officer (with Patrol Car) for Assistance During Construction Operations.

441 ASPHALT CONCRETE

1. The mix design formula for bitumen content and total percent passing No. #4 sieve shall be obtained from O.D.O.T. District Engineer of Tests at 650 Eastern Ave. Chillicothe.
2. All Materials and application shall meet Item 441 of the 2023 O.D.O.T. Construction and Material Specifications. Asphalt content shall be 6.2% PG-64-22.

Asphalt Binder Price Adjustment will not be included in this contract. Also Fuel Price Adjustments will not be included in this contract. Bid price for all items will be Final. No Adjustments will be made.

Except Item 448.02 Density testing will not be required under this contract

3. Samples will be taken at least every 500 tons and the amount paid per 500 tons will be based on the bitumen content.
4. Any deviation from O.D.O.T. Specs of plus or minus 0.5% bitumen content will result in a reduced pay factor as per O.D.O.T.'s policy. Any asphalt concrete containing less than 70% of the mix design formula bitumen content will not be acceptable for payment.
 - A) A deduction will be made for the value of the bitumen below 0.5%.
 - B) A deduction will be made for the loss of life expectancy due to bitumen content being below 0.5%.

OPWC PROPOSAL NOTES – For insertion into Bid Documents (Rev 10/25)

1. STEEL PRODUCTS MADE IN THE UNITED STATES

Domestic steel use requirements as specified in Ohio Rev. Code §153.011, <https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-revised-code/section-153.011>, apply to this project.

2. PREVAILING WAGES ON STATE PROJECTS WITH NO FEDERAL-AID (Should this project contain Federal-aid funds then Federal Prevailing Wages must be paid. Contact the appropriate Federal funding agency for language.)

This contract is subject to Ohio Prevailing Wage Laws, Ohio Rev. Code Chapter 4115 and the Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall comply with all provisions contained therein or as otherwise provided by this note. The Prime Contractor guarantees that the prevailing wage scale to be paid to all laborers and mechanics employed on this contract shall be in accordance with the schedule of the prevailing hourly wage and fringe benefits as determined by the Ohio Department of Commerce for the county in which the work is being performed. The failure to pay prevailing wages to all laborers and mechanics employed on this project shall be considered a breach of contract. Such a failure may result in the revocation of the Prime Contractor's and/or subcontractor's certificate of qualification and debarment. A schedule of the most current prevailing wage rates may be accessed by registering / logging in to the Prevailing Wage Portal maintained by the Ohio Department of Commerce at the following web address: <https://pwr.com.ohio.gov/>.

The Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall compensate the employees on this contract at a pay rate not less than the hourly wage and fringe rate listed on the website noted above, for the applicable job classification or as may be modified by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Labor and Worker Safety Wage and Hour Bureau, when new prevailing rates are established.

Overtime shall be paid at one and one-half times the basic hourly rate for any hours worked beyond forty hours during a pay week. The Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all compensation by company check to the worker and fringe benefit program.

The wage and fringe rates determined for this project or as may be later modified, shall be posted by the Prime Contractor in a prominent and accessible place on the project, field office, or equipment yard where they can be easily read by the workers or otherwise made available to the workers. On the first pay date of contract work the Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall furnish each employee covered by prevailing wage a completed form (WHPW-1512) in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code § 4115.05, showing the classification, hourly pay rate, and fringes, and identifying the public authority's Prevailing Wage Coordinator, if such employees are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement or understanding between employers and bona fide organizations of labor. These forms shall be signed by the Prime Contractor or subcontractor and the employee and kept in the Prime Contractor's or subcontractor's payroll files.

The Prime Contractor shall submit to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator, certified payrolls for Prime Contractor and all subcontractors on form WHPW-1512 or equivalent, in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code Sections 4115.07 and 4115.071(C), three weeks after the start of work and every subsequent week until the completion of the contract. Additionally, a copy of the "Apprentice Certification" obtained from the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council, must accompany all certified payrolls submitted, for all apprentices working on this project. Upon completion of the contract and before the final payment, the Prime Contractor shall submit to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator a final wage affidavit in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code § 4115.07 stating that wages have been paid in conformance with the minimum rates set forth in the contract. Please be aware that it is ultimately the responsibility of the Prime Contractor to ensure that all laws relating to prevailing wages in Ohio Rev. Code Chapter 4115 are strictly adhered to by all subcontractors.

The Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall make all its payroll records available for inspection, copying or transcription by any authorized representative of the contracting agency. Additionally, the Prime Contractor and all subcontractors shall permit such representatives to interview any employees during working hours while the employee is on the job.

3. UNRESOLVED FINDING FOR RECOVERY

The Prime Contractor affirmatively represents to the local contracting authority that it is not subject to a finding for recovery under Ohio Rev. Code § 9.24, or that it has taken the appropriate remedial steps required under §9.24 or otherwise qualifies under that section. The Prime Contractor agrees that if this representation is deemed to be false, the contract shall be void ab initio as between the parties to this contract, and any funds paid by the state hereunder shall be immediately repaid to the local contracting authority, or an action for recovery may be immediately commenced by the local government and/or for recovery of said funds.

4. OHIO WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE

The Prime Contractor must secure and maintain valid Ohio workers' compensation coverage until the project has been finally accepted by the local contracting authority. A certificate of coverage evidencing valid workers' compensation coverage must be submitted to the local contracting authority before the contract is executed.

The Prime Contractor must immediately notify the local contracting authority, in writing, if it or any subcontractor fails or refuses to renew their workers' compensation coverage. Furthermore, the Prime Contractor must notify the local contracting authority, in writing, if its or any of its subcontractor's workers' compensation policies are canceled, terminated or lapse.

The failure to maintain valid workers' compensation coverage shall be considered a breach of contract which may result in the Prime Contractor or subcontractor being removed from the project, withholding of pay estimates and/or termination of the contract.

5. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE PROGRAM

In accordance with Ohio Rev. Code §153.03 and during the life of this project, the Prime Contractor and all its Subcontractors that provide labor on the Project site must be enrolled in and remain in good standing in the Ohio Bureau of Worker's Compensation ("OBWC") Drug-Free Workplace Program ("DFWP") or a comparable program approved by the OBWC.

6. OHIO PREFERENCE

In accordance with Ohio Rev. Code §164.05 (A)(6), to the extent practicable, the Prime Contractor and subcontractor shall use Ohio products, materials, services, and labor in connection with this project.

7. BID GUARANTY
